Making every child bilingual with English

Is it time to aim higher in language education? The organisers of the Bilingual Future Social Education Programme and the publishers Yellow House English believe that it is. The social and economic benefits of bilingualism are well-known. Cognitive development benefits in children have now also been identified by research.

So can language educators broaden their reach and enable every child to become bilingual? The Bilingual Future Social Education Programme believes that this goal is achievable if exposure to an additional language starts at the latest by preschool age. The best time for language learning is between birth and age seven. At this time, the foundations of an additional language, such as grammar rules, pronunciation and natural melody, can be assimilated by the young brain as easily as the foundations of the first or home language.

The key to success is to offer children structured contact with the additional language for a short while every day.

The global priority is for children to learn English as their first additional language, because English has been accepted as the international common language across numerous fields.

What is the goal?

The goal of the Bilingual Future Social Education Programme is to give every child the opportunity to become bilingual with English. The founders of the programme believe that it is time that English stopped being a 'foreign' language and became a natural, additional channel for communication. Within a generation, the barriers to communication and access to the global community could be removed, while preserving the importance of the home language and culture. The value of the Programme lies in bilingualism.

Many organisations promote bilingualism, so how is this Programme different? The Programme has higher targets – a bilingual level of English, not just English teaching. The programme has wider reach – offering all children access to English at a young age, regardless of wealth. It has a clear system for delivery - a coordinated approach in which institutions work together.

How is it working as a system? The system for delivery and distribution has been developed in the home country of the Programme, Poland by founder, Waldemar Miksa. Media and academic institutions, local authorities and preschool networks act as patrons of the programme and work together in a coordinated approach to deliver training programmes for teachers, awareness conferences for parents and guidance for preschools, region by region.

How does the Programme deliver higher learning goals in a new way? The Programme has partnered with specialist author, Claire Selby, and UK publisher, Yellow House English, to build an innovative solution for creative delivery of the goal – the Universal Preschool Course. The

course combines access to English at home and at preschool daily and is designed according to Claire Selby's successful methodology, the Spiral Language System

How is the creative solution – the Universal Preschool Course – new? At the centre of the creative solution is the Universal Preschool Course. This complete, three-year English course builds language awareness and knowledge naturally through structured play. At preschool, the group activities it offers are centred around accepted best ways for children to learn through play – songs, games, craft and focused challenges. The home-learning materials offer individual play activities to enjoy at home.

At its core are TV quality animated songs and stories that have been specifically designed to meet the best quality entertainment production values while delivering the highest standards of educational efficiency. The story settings provide the context for each step of language learning. Natural acquisition of the home-language happens in specific lifecontexts. In order to make learning English as natural as possible, the course creates contexts in which the vocabulary has a clear place.

The revolutionary course not only improves learning outcomes for pupils through its complete home-school programme but also addresses the needs of teachers. It is uniquely offered in four versions - to match the differing teaching circumstances at different preschools.

the core materials of the Universal Preschool Course to stimulate interest in and exposure to English.

The materials are multi-media and many elements can be delivered digitally to schools with suitable equipment. This makes the course accessible equally to remote and city-centre preschools.

The methodology starts from the child's perspective. First contact with English is through the linguistically planned animated adventures that attract children. This 'One Person, One Language' match helps children apply their innate ability to separate languages, to copy native-speakers perfectly, to repeat and to re-use language patterns effortlessly.



The Baby Beetles puppet theatre allows the teacher to replay English scenes in an entertaining and educational way. Its stage and curtains help build the elements of suspense and surprise that hold children's attention, as the puppets appear and disappear from the scenes. The children focus on the stage area and so increase their concentration on the specific topics that the teacher wishes to highlight - but it feels like play! The puppet theatre can be used with the hand puppets, flash-cards and music CDs from the Universal Preschool Course to review, revise, extend and consolidate English learning. Solid and safe, it can be used to encourage bolder children to repeat the phrases from the songs by singing to each other through the stage window. It is ideal for phrases from songs such as I am hiding, Here I am! I am happy! I'm sad, I love you or simply counting 1, 2, 3!

It has built-in shelves to store the puppets and the Baby Beetles learning materials.

BABY BEETLES SOFT TOYS

Who can resist these delightful character toys? You just want to hug one – and so do the children! The big benefit is that these characters are associated with English through the Universal Preschool Course so children tend to use English words and songs from the course when they play with them. This means that it is a good idea for schools to have a set of toys for the class to play with and parents are advised to buy a set of these toys for play at home to support their child's learning of English.



What better place to start playing with the Baby Beetles toys than the vocabulary trainer play-and-learn Baby Beetles rug. The rug re-creates the physical world of the Baby Beetles - their tree-houses, the stream, the road, the windmill, the hills and the sky. The vocabulary placemats add two extra learning dimensions to this well-planned teaching asset. Firstly, pupils are reminded of the English words and the songs by placing the vocabulary mats on the rug. Additionally, the pupils need to match the mats to the right natural environment on the rug. They should place the flower on the grass, the fish in the stream or the pond, the bird on the tree or in the sky, the sun in the sky and so on. This helps develop their general cognitive awareness – in both languages!

The rug creates a wonderful bilingual playcorner in the classroom, together with the other items in the series. It is also a lovely addition to any young child's playroom!

BABY BEETLES SHELF UNIT

Baby Beetles shelf unit completes a colourful, exciting English corner perfectly. The Baby Beetles characters welcome the youngest learners. They live in the sunny, green countryside full of flowers, funny birds and the joy of friendship. Each Baby Beetle has its own personality and, through its games, introduces different areas of vocabulary.





ZOOM

Zoom is the most energetic Baby Beetle so most of his songs include actions. Zoom's vocabulary is based on simple nouns and verbs that describe the toys and activities that are most important to him. He leads the first stage of the course so children learn the simple words for actions as they jump, clap, move, dance, play and sing with him – in English!

RING RING

Ring Ring is the Baby Beetle 'communicator,' so most of his songs include words about feelings and about his family and friends. Children relate easily to the emotions expressed in this character's simple phrases. His songs also help young children to build good social skills.

SPLISH SPLASH

Splish Splash's songs describe the natural world we see around us. Her songs are about using the senses to recognise our environment. They describe what children see and hear, including birds, flowers, animals and the weather.

TICK TOCK

Tick Tock's songs are about the activities we do every day: getting up in the morning; going for a walk; playing with friends and getting ready for bed. He likes to do everything at the right time and in the right order. Using core phrases like 'It is time to...', he introduces the concepts of sequencing and routine. Children are reassured by Tick Tock's bright yellow colour and by his familiar daily activities.

The characters play together and support each other to show good examples of social behaviour, making this a world children want to join.

TOMand KERI

introduce children aged 4-6 to their English-speaking world

The characters are based on universal toys led by Teddy Tom, a playful bear and Dolly Keri, a caring doll character. They have a children's playhouse in the garden that is magic. Each time they enter the playhouse, they find a new location or new adventure. Each episode starts with a device, such as an object or sound, that invites them to enter the playhouse. Their playmates are Dog and Cat. They are always playing in the garden and join in the adventures, sometimes helping and sometimes causing more problems! Good behaviour is rewarded, problems are solved and each adventure provides a new context for presenting words and phrases through dialogue, catchphrases and songs.
